# FROM THE RECTORY

"A moveable feast"

Dear Friends,

This year Easter Sunday is 9<sup>th</sup> April. Next year it will be 31<sup>st</sup> March, then in 2025 it will be 20<sup>th</sup> April. Such changes affect the Bank Holiday weekend dates for families and businesses planning holidays. I know of one school in Manchester – and probably many others - who in 2019 when Easter was 21<sup>st</sup> April took their two weeks break earlier in the month and just the bank holiday Easter Monday on 22<sup>nd</sup> April in their summer term. That was to avoid a very long winter school term and a short summer term. Even now school spring breaks may have Easter at the start or middle or end of the two weeks

The reason for this movement is because at the Church Council in 325 AD it was agreed to link Good Friday - and so Easter - with the Jewish Passover Festival when Jesus was crucified. But the Jewish calendar was a 13-month lunar calendar which didn't fit neatly into European 12-month calendar. So the formula agreed then, and still used today, is to celebrate Easter on the first Sunday after the <u>first full moon</u> on or after 21 March (a fixed approximation of the <u>March equinox</u>). This means that Easter can be fall between 22<sup>nd</sup> March and 25<sup>th</sup> April.

There have been attempts to fix the date of Easter. In the UK, the <u>Easter Act of</u> <u>1928</u> set it for the Sunday following the second Saturday in April. However, the act has never been implemented, and successive governments have left it to churches to agree any such change.

The present Archbishop of Canterbury raised the issue with other Christian church leaders in 2016, and said that attempts to fix the date of Easter went back to the 10<sup>th</sup> century, and so "may take a while".

So, for the present (and foreseeable future?), Easter is very much a "moveable feast", although the Church celebrates Easter every week by meeting to worship on a Sunday, following the gospel story "On the first day of the week, while it was still dark the women went to the tomb, but found the stone rolled away ..."
