Dear friends,

"A moveable feast"

This year Easter Sunday is 9th April. Next year it will be 31st March, then in 2025 it will be 20th April. Such changes affect the bank holiday weekend dates for families and businesses planning holidays. I know of one school in Manchester – and probably many others - who in 2019 when Easter was 21st April took their two week break earlier in the month and just the bank holiday Easter Monday on 22nd April in their summer term. That was to avoid a very long winter school term and a short summer term. Even now school spring breaks may have Easter at the start or middle or end of the two weeks

The reason for this movement is because at the Church Council in 325AD it was agreed to link Good Friday - and so Easter - with the Jewish Passover Festival when Jesus was crucified. But the Jewish calendar was a 13 month lunar calendar which didn't fit neatly into European 12 month calendar. So the formula agreed then, and still used today, is to celebrate Easter on the first Sunday after the <u>first full moon</u> on or after 21 March (a fixed approximation of the <u>March equinox</u>). This means that Easter can be fall between 22nd March and 25th April.

There have been attempts to fix the date of Easter. In the UK, the <u>Easter Act of 1928</u> set it for the Sunday following the second Saturday in April. However, the act has never been implemented, and successive governments have left it to churches to agree any such change.

The present Archbishop of Canterbury raised the issue with other Christian church leaders in 2016, and said that attempts to fix the date of Easter went back to the 10th century, and so "may take a while".

So for the present (and foreseeable future?) Easter is very much a "moveable feast", although the Church celebrates Easter every week by meeting to worship on a Sunday, following the gospel story

"On the first day of the week, while it was still dark the women went to the tomb, but found the stone rolled away ..." wishing you a happy Easter

UNDERSTANDING DEMENTIA


"It's difficult to pinpoint a time when the social part of eating became difficult, when those conversations that crisscrossed the table became confusing to follow, when instead I would drop my napkin into my lap and sit back, listening without contributing. Or when the metallic clang of cutlery on a plate became too loud for my ear, leaving me feeling anxious and unsure.

Eating is such a sensory experience, not in just terms of taste and smell, but also touch, sound and sight. A black tablecloth left me confused about whether the table it covered was a giant sinkhole in the middle of the dining room, and once my eyes had adjusted or my brain had caught up and I realised it was indeed a tablecloth, I had no idea where the table started or ended underneath it.




Mark is currently receiving more treatment, so may be out of action for a while, depending on his response to it. We are praying for a good outcome.

KEMBERTON SOLAR FARM

"The Solar Panel farm proposal finally went to the Planning Committee on the 15th March 2023, when Councillor Richard Marshall, Allan Chatham and the Parish Council solicitor Fred Quartermain, all spoke against the proposal. Nick Williams of Berry's spoke in favour as was the recommendation of the Planning Officer, Grahame French. In the audience were 25 villagers adding weight to how much the sentiment was against the erection of the Solar Farm. After some debate, it went to the vote and it was unanimously voted against, on the grounds of Urban sprawl, loss of core organic farming and introducing an alien and incongruous element into the landscape. I have added the decision at the end.

ST. MARY'S SUTTON MADDOCK CHURCH
