BECKBURY PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on the 7th June and we were pleased to welcome our new Councillor Mat Wild.

Further discussions have taken place regarding the future use of the football pitch and it has been agreed that for the immediate future Beckbury Boys will continue to have exclusive use although this issue will remain under review. We have however decided to impose a small charge for the use in line with what all councils charge for their pitch hire. Currently the Playing Field costs around £2500per annum to run and maintain which is approximately 25% of our income and Councillors felt that a small charge was appropriate.

We are still looking for a Parish Clerk. We would very much wish to recruit someone from the Village or nearby. Volunteers please! Contact David Cummings or Peter Gibbins.

The Parish Council accounts for the year ending 31st March 2023 have been approved and are being audited. Copies can be seen on the Parish Council website.

Sadly our Vicar has retired. We wish Keith and Frances a very long and happy retirement and thank them for all the help and service they have both given to the residents and parishioners of Beckbury. I think they came to Beckbury around 17 years ago (although it seems like last year) and they have become part of the Village. They will be badly missed.

The new playground equipment on the Playing Field has been well received and July saw phase 2 of the project being completed last Saturday in the rain with more equipment being added. Well done to all the volunteers who gave up their time in the wet.

The holidays are now here so let's hope the weather improves and we can enjoy the rest of the summer. Our next meeting will be 7.30 pm Wednesday 6th September. As usual the first 10 minutes is reserved for Parishioners to raise any parish matters.

I had almost given up totally on the idea of cooking again. There have been many kitchen disasters that have brought me to this point: ruined food, burnt pans. In the end it was easier to turn off the cooker completely. But then, on one of my daily trundles around the village, something caught my eye. I pass the same house every day, sometimes pausing to take photographs of the two woolly sheep that stand in the field alongside it. As I do, I often hear the muted clucks of hens. But I had never noticed the little honesty box just off the verge and the stack of freshly laid eggs beside it.

Could I remember how to boil an egg? I picked one up, perfectly shaped, and turned it around inside my palm.

At home I stood once again in front of the cooker and a memory tugged at my sleeve: a pan bubbling away on each hob, steam filling the kitchen, scents of various home cooked dishes mingling in the air above me. Instead now the room felt quiet and still.

My iPad was upstairs and there was no point trying to consult it; by the time I arrived upstairs to retrieve it, the question would have drifted away. And so I decided to start with the cooker. Who new if it even worked anymore? I turned the knob belonging to each burner. Nothing flickered or glowed orange with life until the final one-the spark of life. Perhaps a muscle memory remained-had it once been my favourite? Who new?

Hi All,

We are excited to be launching a new series of sessions at the Cathie Sabin Community Tennis Centre in conjunction with the Shropshire Healthy Lives Advisors. The sessions have been designed to make tennis more accessible and adapt the game, equipment & rules to enable the wider community to be able to get on court.

Walking Tennis - Mondays 11.00am - 12.00noon

A slower version of conventional tennis, played on a normal tennis court with slower balls and adapted rules to enable players to serve, rally & score without having to run. Ideal for those with restricted mobility or fitness.

Short Tennis - Thursdays 11.00am - 12.00noon

Tennis played on a smaller sized court (similar to badminton size) with smaller rackets & sponge balls. Ability to get competitive within a smaller environment which is slower and easier to grasp for beginners to the game especially.

Movement & Balance - Fridays: 11.00am - 12.00noon

Adapted tennis based games & activity with a specific focus on agility, balance & coordination. Using both rackets & balls this session will focus on having fun & getting active without playing over a net or being competitive. A fantastic variation which will use our tennis equipment to get people active.

We have produced a video explaining the different sessions that are on offer and all sessions will be bookable via the link below. We are happy for the first session to be FOC as a trial and then people are able to book on a pay & play basis:

Badger Parish Council Meeting

A meeting of Badger Parish Council was held on Tuesday 25 July 2023. No parishioners were present for the Open Forum.

Matters discussed included the completion of the first cuts to the village verges, the successful re-thatching of the bus shelter and the ongoing closure of the bridleway over the Dingle to Ackleton. Councillors expressed concern over this and agreed to write to Shropshire Council and the landowner's agents, Balfours, for an update as to what action is being taken, and to find out when the bridleway is likely to be reopened.

The date for the next Council meeting will be on Tuesday 26 September 2023 at 7pm.

You will get an email confirming your booking. When you submit the booking, you are agreeing that you have read and will comply with the terms and conditions including the Fire Policy and the Closing Down procedure.

Please be aware that you need to pay for the hire of the hall for all the hours that you use it, including any preparation and clearing up. You cannot assume that you can set up at any time that you have not hired the hall. i.e. if <u>you</u> hire the hall from 6pm to 10pm, you cannot access it for any purpose before 6pm or after 10pm. This is to avoid any bookings before or after yours being disrupted. Thank you.
