FROM THE RECTORY

We are still here!

Dear friends

One or two people are asking (and more wondering) when a new vicar will be coming. The short answer is that we do not know

The longer explanation is that that are several procedures and processes to be dealt with. At present the Bishop has encouraged our six church committees to work out a new constitution which will make for fewer meetings requiring clergy attendance, and so, hopefully they say, make the position of vicar here with six churches more appealing.

I moved from full time to half time just before Covid to ease the financial outgoings of the six churches. I was able to do that because I had just started receiving my state pension, so did not suffer too much of a drop in income. A new vicar will most likely expect and need a full salary (unless their spouse is in a full time job) so the diocese may look to combine the half time position in the Six Parishes with another half time position in the area or in the diocese.

Only after these two things have been agreed and worked out, can a "parish profile" be drawn up, advertising the vacancy and the "job spec". Applicants can then be interviewed and the successful candidate would need to give their present parish(es) three months' notice before moving here.

So we are still here at the Rectory, although I have retired as 'the rector'. We are sorting out church documents, and getting ready to move in August/September, which leads into the other question people ask us "where are you moving to?" As we do not own and cannot afford to buy a house, we are able to rent a property from the C of E. With family in south Birmingham we hoped to be given a house there, but with no properties or vacant houses in our preferred areas, we have agreed to move to a house in Erdington which is northeast of "Spaghetti Junction" on the M6.

The house looks onto a park but nothing like our present view across to Patshull Hall and Pattingham.

So the short answer to when will a new vicar be coming is still "we do not know "

Further extract from Sally Mitchell's book

On boiling an egg. I had almost given up totally on the idea of cooking again. There have been many kitchen disasters that have me to this point: ruined food, burnt pans. In the end it was easier to turn off the cooker completely. But then, on one of my daily trundles around the village, something caught my eye. I pass the same house every day, sometimes pausing to take photographs of the two woolly sheep that stand in the field alongside it. As I do, I often hear the muted clucks of hens. But I had never noticed the little honesty box just off the verge and the stack of freshly laid eggs beside it. Could I remember how to boil an egg? I picked one up, perfectly shaped, and turned it around inside my palm.

At home I stood once again in front of the cooker and a memory tugged at my sleeve: a pan of bubbling away on each hob, steam filling the kitchen, scents of various home cooked dishes mingling in the air above me. Instead now the room felt quiet and still.

My iPad was upstairs and there was no point trying to consult it; by the time I arrived upstairs to retrieve it, the question would have drifted away. And so I decided to start with the cooker. Who knew if it even if it worked anymore? I turned the knob belonging to each burner. Nothing flickered or glowed orange with life until the final one-the spark of life. Perhaps a muscle memory remained-had it once been my favourite? Who knew?
