An extract from a book by Wendy Mitchell. On Dreams.

Do dreams count as hallucinations? If our brains can run riot in the day, then why not at night? My dreams have definitely changed post my dementia diagnosis. Sleep now is a visitor who drops in infrequently. Most nights are spent lying in bed, my eyelids closed, my eyeballs staring into the nothingness behind them. At first I would find this night-time routine exhausting, but now I have given in to it. I simply lie there, allowing my body to relax, waiting for the morning, grateful for any few minutes that I drift off, in and out of the blackness of the night.

It is said that people regress to a different era in the latter stages of this disease, that the mind somehow chooses a shelf of a former life in the great bookcase that makes up our story. I no longer dream of the present, only the past. It's as though my dreams have regressed before my brain has, and are opening a window to the reality that I may be immersed in during the latter stages of dementia. Perhaps my dreams return me there because, for a time, it was a happy period of my life. My daughters are always young, usually around six and three. Sarah is often doing an adult job like working in an NHS call centre-she sits, all three feet of her, at a giant desk in an oversized office chair, her feet dangling mid-air, unable to quite reach the floor. Gemma is still a tiny child and I am a young mum- our roles reversed just for that moment in time, when once again it is me holding their hands. In my dreams I rarely have dementia, which should be comforting, until I wake and find it keeping me company on the pillow.

BECKBURY COMMUNITY SHOP

Please help!

You may have noticed that we recently had to close the community shop for a short time due to shortage of volunteers. We hate doing this but sometimes it is just unavoidable.

We have a wonderful group of volunteers, not only serving in the shop but, looking after the structure of the shop, gardening, sorting the newspapers, collecting the bread, keeping the shop suplied with stock, baking cakes etc etc. but we always need more. Just two or three more would make a big difference. One session a month or once a fortnight is a big help.

We have only had to close a total of three times for a short period in the nearly 6 years since we opened, but this is solely down to the generosity of volunteers who often step in at the last minute and do what is really beyond the call of duty, doing two and sometimes three sessions per week. This isn't sustainable, if we want to keep the shop open we need just a few more volunteers.

It's a great way to get to know people and to join a great group of people who often socialise together, especially at our quarterly get-togethers.

BECKBURY PARISH COUNCIL

We held our first council meeting of 2024 on the evening of the 10th January in the Village Hall. It was a very cold night and the heating was not on. Nevertheless, we continued in good spirit and after some discussion agreed that the precept for the coming financial year should remain at £10,000, the same as last year.

The playground on the Playing Field seems to be well used. A pump (BMX) track is planned to be installed in or around February. Dee Holes has created a "Book Tree" at the entrance to the car park where people can borrow books and donate books.

The Council have approved a quotation for the installation of a street light close to the entrance to the Village Hall so people using the Hall will not be in almost complete darkness. Hopefully this will be installed sometime in the near future and in any event before next autumn/winter.

We had reported to Councils Highways Department the rather deep pothole/subsidence in the road opposite the car park to the Smokey Cow. Regrettably, and surprisingly the Council have declined to do anything about it. If anyone is concerned about any issues of Village Maintenance, roads drains etc, please let us know so we can try and resolve the issue with Shropshire Council.

The Parish Council still wish to recruit a Clerk. There is a short job description in the shop. If there is a computer literate man or woman interested please contact either myself or Peter Gibbins.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday 6th March at 7.30pm. The first 10 minutes are reserved for parishioners to attend and raise any matters of concern.
