

FROM THE RECTORY

Revd Martin's granny's toe nails

Dear friends,

Taking services and making visits in our six villages means that I drive along all the country lanes linking our parishes. So I enjoy the changing seasons displayed in trees, hedges, fields and verges. In May there was the wonderful show of white flowers on both sides of the lanes.

The question is what do you call those flowers? I think most of us say “cow parsley”, or “Queen Anne’s Lace”. But checking this, I found out that Queen Anne’s Lace is also the name for a similar flower called wild carrot.

Having spent a lot of these Covid restricted months discovering new walks and footpaths around Pattingham, Claverley and Bobbington, I have been looking up the names of some of the wild flowers I’ve seen. One of the books that I use is by Revd Keble Martin (died 1969) who studied botany at Oxford University. As you might expect he uses scientific descriptions (decumbent; stipules ovate; penduncle filiform) but he does include some of the popular names for the plants.

However, I was checking one flower recently, which I know as “bacon and eggs! – that low spreading plant with flowers that are yellow with some red as well – to see that Revd Martin only refers to it as “birds foot trefoil”. One of its other names is “granny’s toenails”. You need to see the flower and maybe your granny’s toenails to see the connection?

There are some wonderful country names for our wild flowers; e.g. ‘Jack in the pulpit’; ‘yellow archangel’; ‘yellow rattle’; ‘ragged robin’. You may have heard the definition that a weed is a wild flower in the wrong place? While I don’t encourage wild flowers in my garden, they are a delight to see in our countryside, and worth the effort of finding them.

All things bright and beautiful.....each little flower that opens

UNDERSTANDING DEMENTIA

Go to your room and think about this, don't come back and tell me you are sorry. I know what you are talking about – just stop doing it and we will get along very well....and probably better than you think!

Some numbers and facts: There are around 850,000 people with dementia in the UK with this projected to rise to 1.6 million by 2040. 209,600 people will develop dementia this year, that's one every 3 minutes. 1 in 6 people over the age of 80 has dementia. 70% of people in care homes have dementia or severe memory loss. There are more than 42,000 people under 65 with dementia in the UK.

Dementia is a long road and prides itself on the one quality it has no other disease can boast. It can take more of a toll on the carer than the person with dementia. It is the carer who watches their loved one slowly depart. There is no cure yet, and no effective treatment.

BECKBURY COMMUNITY SHOP

It is great that our community shop has had exceptional community support since its opening in March '18. This has not only brought our community together, and provided a great place to shop, but also it has produced a profit which can support local causes. The shop has now completed three whole financial years and we are therefore delighted to announce details of our Grant Scheme.

What we will fund

The grants panel will consider applications for projects whose beneficiaries live within 2 miles of the shop and the aim of which is to in some way benefit the community.

Who can apply

Community organisations or individuals are eligible to apply for funding for beneficiaries within the qualifying area.

The total grant fund available this year is £4,000; you can apply for any amount up to this maximum.

July on the allotment

On the whole the weather has been pretty good for our newly planted vegetables, let's hope July continues to be warm and sunny too. I know us gardeners are never happy with the British weather!

Weeds are going to be a big problem though, so hoe regularly to break up the soil and to remove them. However, if it's warm and damp watch out for potato blight.

It's now getting late in the year for sowing and planting, but there is still time for lettuces, chicory, endives and other salad leaves as well as fast growing varieties of peas, beetroot and carrots. If you have been harvesting your broad beans, garlic, onions and shallots there may be room to transplant Brussel sprouts, cabbages and cauliflower that you have raised from seed in pots. If you fancy growing potatoes for Christmas now is the time to plant them.

Many vegetables will be ready to harvest now, including beetroot, carrots, potatoes, onions, garlic, peas and broad beans.....if you have a glut then freezing, chutney and jam making can be a great idea, as well as drying onions and garlic for storing.
