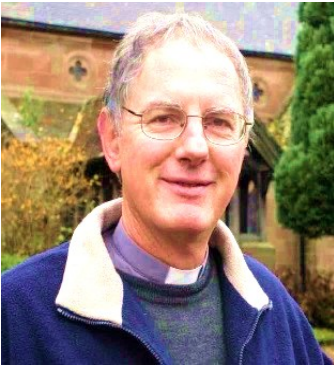

## **FROM THE RECTORY**

### **The End is Nigh?**

Dear friends,

I haven't seen old men with 'sandwich boards' over their shoulders in shopping precincts for years. Probably social media has become the modern way to make announcements.

"The End" used to refer to the biblical stories and warnings about the end of the world, the apocalypse, and Judgement Day. But in a more positive way, I think we are all waiting for the end of the Covid 19 restrictions. The government has given 21<sup>st</sup> June as the date "no earlier than" all restrictions may be lifted. So we all wait and see how the government and its teams will assess the factors in their decision.

We have already enjoyed Stage 2 on April 12<sup>th</sup> which allowed slightly bigger groups to meet together, shops including hair-dressers to open, and pubs and restaurants to serve people outside.

Stage 3 may be this month – "no earlier than 17<sup>th</sup> May". If it goes ahead, then we can look forward to meeting in groups of up to 30 outdoors (but only 6 indoors); pubs and restaurants serving indoors and cinemas and hotels opening, among other easements.

For churches Stage 3 means up to 30 people will be able to attend weddings and christenings, the same number as has been allowed for funerals since 29<sup>th</sup> March. Summer wedding families are waiting for announcements on 21<sup>st</sup> June when all restrictions may be lifted. We hope this includes being able to sing hymns and not having to wear masks.

"The End is nigh", though many are saying that we will be living with the Corona virus from now on, as we have been doing for decades with the 'flu virus.

Still, however, we are advised to remain careful and cautious, and follow current recommendations about masks, washing and distancing.

## **BECKBURY ALLOTMENTS ASSOCIATION**

Lighter evenings mean we get more chance to spend on our allotments. There's a buzz about the place.....added confidence that we've all had our first vaccines and an eagerness to get on and back to some sort of 'normal'. Temperatures are rising but there is always a chance of ground frost so be prepared to protect your lovingly grown tender vegetables. By the end of the month you should definitely be safe to plant out.

### **Jobs to be getting on with:**

- ! Mulch your strawberries with a thick layer of clean straw
- ! Sow cauliflower, carrots, chicory, French and runner beans, parsley, spinach and Swiss chard outside
- ! Sow sweetcorn, courgettes, marrow, pumpkins and squash indoors
- ! Harden off brassicas, celery, celeriac, courgettes, fennel and leeks
- ! Provide support for peas and sturdy wigwams/frames for runner beans
- ! Sow herb seeds outdoors
- ! Remove raspberry canes that have grown away from their rows
- ! Protect fruit with netting or a cage
- ! Harvest early broad beans and rhubarb
- ! Plant asparagus crowns
- ! Chit and plant out second early potatoes in the first half of the month
- ! Melons can be sown indoors on a sunny window sill or heated greenhouse

Winter is well and truly over (not that we really had one in my eyes). From now until autumn it's planting, watering, feeding and harvesting. Sadly weeding and hoeing too.....but we won't dwell on that. At the end of the day we'll have amazingly healthy fruit and vegetables to bring to our tables in the knowledge we have grown them ourselves.

I'm pleased to say all our plots are now taken. Welcome to our new allotment holders. It's going to be lovely to see a 'sea' of vegetables this year and maybe a few flowers too.

## **SCAMS ON THE GO AT THE MOMENT**

We have been made aware of numerous SCAMS that are currently going around. Those brought to our attention are from:

DVLA (email), stating that your vehicle is not taxed, and to use your credit card, rather than debit card.

BT calling to advise that your contract is about to expire and to click on the following link for more details. BT have been contacted and say they have not and never would make such a call.

More alarmingly however, a victim was contacted by someone purporting to be from their bank, informing them that their account had been compromised, and to transfer their savings to a "safe" account and as a result, a substantial amount of money was lost. These offenders are very convincing and can catch anyone off guard with this type of contact. Remember, that your bank will NEVER ask for your passwords, PIN numbers, or send a courier around to you to collect money. Also do not call them back on the number they phoned you on, as this will more than likely be a "cloned" number and not traceable.
