#### **Final Christmas Willow Weaving Course**

I will be running my <u>final</u> Christmas Willow Weaving Day course in Beckbury Village Hall on Saturday November 4<sup>th</sup> 2023, for ten people from 10:00am to 4:00pm. I will provide the willow and some equipment. Beginners will tackle a simple star to start with which can have, e.g., tinsel, LED lights &/or ivy and ribbons intertwined to make a hanging decoration. Other items that can then be tried, include 2D or 3D Christmas trees, stars of various other designs, wreaths, small reindeers, angels, mince pie platters, bells, balls, bauble holders and 'scribble' Christmas trees and stars. If you have attended a previous course you may wish to do your own thing from the start – the instructions for a range of items will be available.







The cost will be £35.00 per person, which will cover the hire of the village hall and the willow. I will give my time free! Any spare willow left at the end can be taken home to make further items.

BECKBURY COMMUNITY SHOP

Each year Beckbury Community Shop distributes its profits to benefit local good causes. Anyone can apply for funds, as long as the cause is local.

The Community Shop announced this year's grants at at their Annual Members Meeting on the 14th September.

The results of the committee's deliberations were as follows:

- 1. **Julie Pleydell** was granted £180 for the purchase of 1000 daffodil & narcissus bulbs to be planted on the boundary between the school & the playing field.
- 2. **Alma Petford** was granted £160 towards the cost of hiring the village hall for a Craft Day for residents from Beckbury & surrounding villages.
- 3. **Tim Dukes** was granted £260 as a contribution towards the costs of maintaining Ryton Churchyard.
- 4. **David Tooth** was granted £600 as a contribution towards the costs of maintaining Beckbury Churchyard.
- 5. **David Cunningham** was granted £400 for fencing & signage for the new Cycle Pump Track.
- 6. **Heather Thomas** was granted £4000 towards the costs of installing Sound Absorption Panels to the Village Hall ceiling.
- 7. Holly Wainwright (on behalf of Beckbury School) was granted £620 towards the costs of clearing & refurbing the school garden.

We would like to record our thanks to Beryl Tooth who stepped down as a shop manager last year and Jane Smith who stepped down this year from the Management Committee. Anne Banks, Vicky Grimshaw and Tim Dukes were elected as new managers. We welcome them to the team and look forward to working with them.

### How to hire Beckbury Village Hall

To hire the hall please go to: <a href="mailto:beckburyvillagehall.co.uk">beckburyvillagehall.co.uk</a> . Click on the 'BOOK NOW' tab and scroll down the page to find the date that you want.... please check it is available at the time you want it. Complete the booking form and submit it.

You will get an email confirming your booking. When you submit the booking. you are agreeing that you have read and will comply with the terms and conditions including Fire Policy and the Closing Down procedure.

Please be aware that you need to pay for the hire of the hall for all the hours that you use it, including any preparation and cleaning up time. You cannot assume that you can set up or leave equipment in the hall at any time that you have not hired the hall. i.e. if you hire

the hall from 6pm to 10pm, you cannot access it for any purpose before 6pm or after 10pm, nor leave anything in the hall. This is to avoid bookings before or after yours being disrupted. Thank you.
