Dear Friends

MOT Test

In the middle of writing this letter in mid August I had a phone call to say that my car had passed its MOT test. *Hooray*! It is not an old car (2012) but I still get

a little worried when it's MOT time, in case the garage discover a major fault which means an expensive repair.

Also on the same day as this year's MOT test we had our hot water and central heating boiler serviced. I am not so worried about that as the Diocese of Lichfield cover that cost.

Because I live here as a sort of tenant – or a resident in a tied property, meaning the house is linked to the job – the Church is a landlord and so looks after all its clergy properties, rectories and vicarages very well. This not only includes a "quinquennial inspection" every five years to check whether any repairs are needed or whether improvements can be made (budget allowing of course) but also a landlord's statutory requirements for things like fire/smoke alarms. These sadly are sometimes sensitive to the breakfast toaster fumes, and occasionally to steam from the bathroom in the winter months - and aren't they loud when they go off ?

The boiler service firm which the diocese use have in recent years needed to check for legionnaires disease in our water tank up in the attic. Standards increase year on year.

While we sometimes run into irritating Health & Safety rules and regulations in general they are in place to improve or safeguard our health and our safety (!)

Before moving here one of my previous parishes was a North Warwickshire mining village - though the pit had just closed a couple of years before I went there. But I had several funerals of old miners who had spent all their working lives at the coal face and suffered from lung, breathing or chest problems. They had started work as teenagers before health and safety measures were in place.

Nowadays there are many recommendations about every aspect of our lives and our health, both physical and mental. The

Bible has some recommendations about these as well including the spiritual dimension. A recent study found that people (from more than two dozen countries) who follow a religion through active participation in congregations tend to be happier, though they were not always healthier in terms of exercise and being over-weight.

How would we rate on a happiness scale ? How would we do in a spiritual MOT test? The bible indicates that there is one for all of us at the end of the road.
