Dear Friends,

What was God thinking about on that first Christmas day?

If you were in charge and you knew that the king of Kings, Prince of Peace was coming, then the least you would have done would be to book him in the penthouse suite of a four- or five-star hotel. After all some of the most important and influential people would be visiting him.

So, what was God thinking on that first Christmas?

The Roman Emperor decided that he wanted to know exactly how many people he ruled over, so that he could see how important he was. Therefore, everyone had to travel to their ancestral homes in order to be counted in his census. Mary and Joseph had to make the long journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, and when they got there, it was packed out. No room anywhere for them to stay, and so, Jesus was born in a cave at the back of an Inn where animals were kept.

So, what in the world was God thinking about?

A clue might be given to God's thinking in the first people who were told of Jesus' birth. The shepherds were going about their business protecting their sheep from wolves and thieves. They were despised by all those who regarded themselves as righteous and religious, because shepherds could not fulfil their religious duties because of their work. St. Luke tells us that when the angel appeared to the shepherds, they were terrified, because they knew that according to their faith if anyone who saw an angel it meant death. No small wonder that they were terrified. However, the angel said to them "Do not be afraid - I am bringing you good news of God's love and peace; he brings renewal, not retribution. Jesus is the Prince of Peace, not of punishment. God wants us to rejoice in, not to hide from, the news of Jesus' birth.

Can we grasp that at the heart of our Christmas celebrations is the truth that the God who Came to us in the birth of Jesus, is the God who is vulnerable. The whole message begins with parents who are poor, who have nowhere to have their baby; a newborn baby who has no crib for a bed; visitors who have no influence.

So, because of Christmas there is no need to fear; there are no barriers to overcome; no person is too poor, too uneducated, too insignificant to come to this God who was born a vulnerable baby

That is what God was thinking of on that first Christmas. So, let us come and adore him.

May I on behalf of myself, Jane and all our family wish you all a very joyful Christmas, and if it's not too early a peaceful and happy New Year.
